3rd MASTERS' INTERNATIONAL CANADIAN OPEN SPEED SKATING

The Quebec Speed Skating Federation and Speed Skating Canada hereby take the pleasure of inviting you to take part in the **Masters' International Canadian Open Speed Skating Competition**

> Anneau Gaétan Boucher, Québec, Canada, January 23 and 24, 2010

This competition is to be held in accordance with the following conditions of contest, the Rules of the International Masters' Speed Skating Committee (IMSSC) and the Rules of the International Skating Union (ISU) at the covered 400m speed skating track of the Anneau Gaétan Boucher, Québec, Canada, on artificial ice. This competition is a regular event on the International ISU Calendar.

Competitions (three and four distances competitions)

Ladies (age groups 30 - 60): 500m, 1500m, 1000m, 3000m

Ladies (age groups 65 and higher): 500m, 1000m, 1500m

Men (age groups 30 and higher): 500m, 1500m, 1000m, 3000m

The number of competitors on the 3000m distance (longest distance) will not be restricted. No members of national selections/teams are allowed to participate. Quartet start may be used for all distances except the 500m.

It would be possible to do team pursuit: Men 6 laps and Women 4 laps

2. Age-groups:

The competitions take place in five year age groups (AG) as follows:

Eligibility

To be eligible the skater must be a member of a National Speed Skating Federation recognized by the ISU and must have a license of his/her federation.

Drawing, Classification

Neighboured five year age groups with a small number of participants may be put together for drawing and speed skating in the competition (in these combined age groups the age group of each skater will be written behind his/her name in the protocol). The classification however will be done separately in 5 year age groups independent of the number of participants in an age group. The winner of a three-distance contest or a four-distance contest in his/her age group is the skater who has completed successfully all distances and has obtained the lowest total of points in his/her 5year age group.

Prizes and Results

The top 3 skaters per age class will receive an overall classification award. Results will be published during and after the competition and available on the Quebec Speed Skating Federation and Speed Skating Canada website.

Anti-Doping Conditions

Anti-doping tests may be made in accordance with 2008 ISU Rule 139 and carried out in accordance with the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport.
